Play with Dirt!



Milkweed grows best with good, healthy soil. Change into working clothes and fill a flower pot nearly to the top with soil.

Make sure everyone digs in and feels the nutrient-rich soil. If your kids have a little

Monarch Naptime



Even monarchs need a place to stop and rest. Have your little ones gather sticks and stones in the backyard

to place in your container. Just like people, monarch butterflies need naps to stay healthy.

Find a Sunny Spot



Have the kids pick a bright, sunny place near their bedroom window, patio or sandbox. Remind your little ones that plants need sunshine to make food. Protect your

monarchs and avoid a particularly windy location.

Step A Home for Caterpillars



Monarch mothers lay eggs on one plant: milkweed. Butterfly or Showy Milkweed grow in most climates (consult your local gardening expert). Healthy, watered milkweed increases your chances of spring monarchs stopping by and laying

their eggs in your garden. Since the "milk" or sap inside of milkweed can be harmful when ingested, be mindful of very small children and pets.

ep Decorate Your Container



Monarch butterflies may have traveled all the way from Canada or Mexico to your backyard. Adding a sign to your garden will remind the whole family of this amazing, yearly migration.

- Take turns and draw butterflies on the container.
- Add glitter (not on plants or soil).
- Create cutouts of monarch butterflies and glue onto an ice pop stick.
- Write "Welcome to (Insert City or State)" on your sign.
